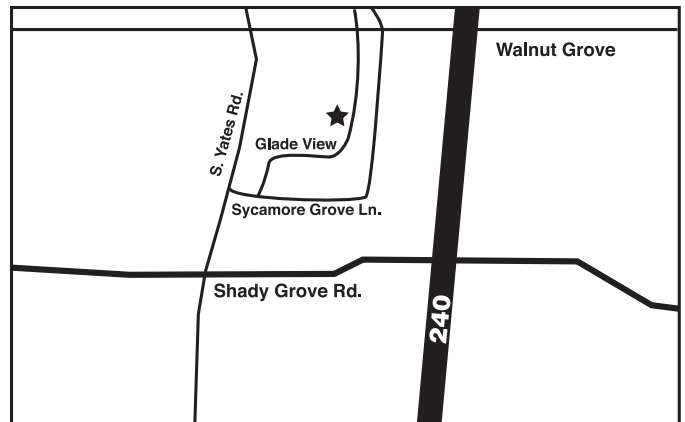

A triptych by Jane W. Williams is on display at the Memphis International Airport, placed by the Urban Art Commission's Moveable Collection.

Annabelle Meacham has a one-person show, "Transitions," at the Plough Library at Christian Brothers University. About two years ago, she began a change to a more metaphysical element in her work. Her art is still about mental associations, and about exploring and making images of those associations. She is largely concentrating on her relationship with animals and plants. The show will be exhibited daily from May 18 to July 31.

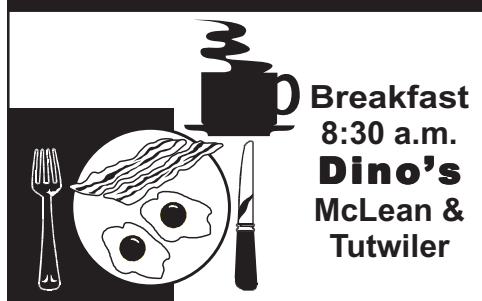
Errata
